

Mission

The mission of Holy Angels Academy is to educate and form our youth by the means of Catholic schooling in the classical tradition, so as to prepare them to lead holy and honorable lives for God and country and thus attain the end for which they were created, that is, eternal happiness with God in Heaven.

History & Purpose

In the early nineteen seventies a small group of lay faithful sought the help of a Dominican Sister to establish a school which would provide authentic Catholic education for our young people. At a time when many teachings of the Faith were being called into question and secular influences were impacting public as well as Catholic education at all levels, there were those, lay and religious, who acted to establish private schools that would preserve Catholic education in accord with the **Magisterium** of the Church, profess a special fidelity to the Holy Father and a love and respect for the local Bishop. Faithful adherence to the documents of **Vatican Council II** and papal documents regarding Catholic education would serve as guiding principles.

Further, these loyal Catholics would seek to preserve sound pedagogical practices in all academic areas in the face of the flawed experimentation becoming more and more prevalent in modern education. Content in curriculum would need to be free of "political correctness," based on fact and in harmony with Christian values.

Holy Angels Academy was one of these pioneering schools established for the above purpose. It was **Sister Mary Elise Groves, O.P.** and a few laity who were founders. In May of 1973 Holy Angels was incorporated as a private independent school in the State of Kentucky. Recognition as a Catholic school was granted by the local ordinary, Archbishop Thomas J. McDonough.

Following the formation of a governing board the Academy was consecrated to the **Sacred and Immaculate Hearts** and was dedicated to all the **Holy Angels** surrounding the throne of God. Its future was entrusted to the guidance of the **Holy Spirit**. Later it was decided that the everlasting motto should be **Ad Majorem Dei Gloriam** (For the Greater Glory of God). The official colors of the school became blue and green.

Sister Elise

Sister Mary Elise Groves, O.P., a native of Louisville, was a promoter and defender of truth, always faithful to the Dominican motto, *Veritas*. She was not only a founder but the first principal and the persevering force behind the survival and stability of Holy Angels. Sister Elise, at the age of sixty, accepted an invitation to embark upon something new and challenging in Catholic education. After receiving permission from her Dominican Order, Sister would share her wisdom with yet another generation of young people.

With many years of experience as an administrator and teacher at the elementary and secondary levels,

Sister Elise would use her fine Dominican training to lay a foundation for what Holy Angels is today. She did so at great personal sacrifice. Enduring physical hardship, as well as rejection and criticism at the hands of clergy, fellow religious and laity, Sister always persevered for souls. In all considerations she was dedicated to her young charges saying, "We must do what is best for the children."

At the age of eighty in 1993, Sister Elise was called to live out her final days at the Dominican Motherhouse of Saint Catherine near Springfield, Kentucky. She passed from this world to her eternal reward July 28, 2003.

ST. CATHARINE, Ky. - Though a career educator, Dominican Sister Mary Elise Groves has never been one to do things by the book.

The diminutive, 81-year-old nun went out on her own to start a private Catholic elementary school - Holy Angels Academy - in 1973, has been active in the pro-life movement and in the past could be seen praying the rosary in front of abortion clinics. She continues to wear her full habit every day.

"She's certainly one who's not afraid to stand up for her convictions," said Joseph Norton, principal if of Holy Angels, located in Old Louisville at 1408 S. Second St. He added that Sister Groves has held the line on church teaching in the last 20 to 30 years while "many of those in the church have strayed." Sister Groves retired earlier this month to Sansbury Infirmary on the grounds of the Dominican Motherhouse after six decades as an educator. In a recent interview, she talked about the reasons she has such strong convictions and about why it is important for her to maintain the traditional appearance of a woman religious. "I don't mind standing up," she said. "I want people to know what I stand for. The people - they recognize me. They come to me, and they talk to me no matter where I am - even at the races."

She added: "No matter where am, someone comes and I can help. You can do so much more this way."

When Sister Groves started Holy Angels, she did so without much help. She had the assistance of her long-time secretary, Marie Noonan, but the school was not, and is not today, supported by any particular parish.

Instead, direct appeal to parents and friends of the school, bingo and tuition are the financial mainstays of Holy Angels, which draws students from a number of Catholic parishes in Jefferson County and Southern Indiana with the largest number coming from St. Louis Bertrand Church, 1104 S. Sixth St., where the school was once located. Norton, who succeeded Sister Groves as principal of the school eight years ago, credited the nun's perseverance with maintaining the school when it was "run on a shoe string."

"Sister has kept this school going since 1973," Norton said. "This school was quite an undertaking. God chooses a unique individual for something like that."

Even at bingos, Sister Groves was always ready to pitch in to raise money for the school, Norton added.

"She'd jump in there just like anybody else," he said. "You might find her out selling pull tabs on the floor . . . in that habit if they needed her to do it. That kind of determination, perseverance, hard work on her part and her faith in God is what's kept this school going."

Norton recalled that when Sister Groves was principal of Holy Angels she would even drive her station wagon to the students' homes to make sure they had a ride to school.

When asked what her motivation was for working so hard on behalf of Holy Angels Academy, Sister Groves answered matter-offactly, "educating children in the faith."

"I really think that there couldn't be anything better than Catholic education," she said. "The interest is in doing what's right and on getting to heaven. That's the most important thing, (getting) to heaven."

The children "mean a whole lot," she added. "I knew we would give them the best, and we have given them the best."

Holy Angels Academy adheres to the vision and values advocated by Sister Groves, Norton said. Loyalty to the pope and to the Catholic Church is critical to the school's mission. Pictures of Pope John Paul II and religious statues and artifacts are arranged throughout the school building.

The goal of the school is to educate Catholics and non-Catholics alike in a safe environment with sound academics, good discipline and a reverence for God and faith, he added.

Norton describes Holy Angels as "more traditional" in its approach to education than public or other Catholic schools because it follows Sister Groves' philosophy of "not abandoning the tried and true methods in education."

"Sister has always stuck to the things that worked, yet, at the same time, Sister's open to things that are new if they're good," he said.

The school boasts a curriculum where "the best of the new meets the best of the old." While the students learn about technology in a computer lab, they also use "old Catholic readers . . . I used when I was in school," said Norton.

Latin is also taught at Holy Angels. Sister Groves spent her last year at the school teaching the language to eighth-graders.

"I tried to get them prepared for their language in high school," she said. "I don't know why they've cut (Latin) out in high school because it affects so many other languages.

After an early history of uncertainty when the school struggled with finances and enrollment and changed locations several times, things have stabilized at Holy Angels. The school currently has no debts, Norton said, and is expecting an all-time high enrollment of 115-120 students this fall.

This growth and stability is particularly satisfying to Sister Groves.

"It means a whole lot to me because we're (continuing) to teach the faith to the children," she said. "Not only that, we're giving them a good education that can stand up to any place."

Sister Groves added that she is gratified when students come back to visit and report that they are still going to church and remember what they were taught about the Catholic faith.

In more than 60 years of educating and influencing the lives of children, Sister Groves said that she never experienced burnout.

"I was just so busy all the time (that) I didn't have time to be burned out," she said. "You just . . . do what the Lord wants you to do."

Marie Noonan

Marie Noonan, a member from the founding in 1973, assisted Sister Elise for years to follow. She and her husband, Robert, provided unfailing support for the Academy while raising nine children. From assisting with financial responsibilities as Treasurer on the Board of Trustees to handling a host of administrative and secretarial duties, she was a steady pillar of support. Of Marie Noonan, Sister Elise once said, "I could not have done it without her." Mrs. Noonan was a fine example of service to the Church during the "age of the laity." She was called from this life on May 15, 2011. Her son, Father Pius Mary Noonan, O.S.B., the first graduate of Holy Angels to be ordained to the holy priesthood, celebrated his mother's Mass of Christian Burial. A Benedictine monk, he serves as the founding prior of the Notre Dame Priory in Tasmania.

Joseph Norton

Mr. Joseph Norton, relocating from Lexington, Kentucky, began teaching at Holy Angels Academy in 1983. Five years later, in 1988, Mr. Norton would succeed Sr. Mary Elise to become the second head of school in the academy's history. Mr. Norton would spend the next 34 years guiding Holy Angels Academy. Always prioritizing preservation of the school's mission and philosophy, he also protected the academy's very existence during an era of Catholic school closures. "It is truly a blessing from heaven," said Mr. Norton, "to assist parents in the formation of their children." Undoubtedly most important of all, Mr. Norton's tenure as headmaster was characterized by fervent prayer and an unfailing faith and trust in God.

Establishment of the High School Grades

It was in 1995 that Joseph Norton asked an experienced educator, Marilyn Malone, to undertake the

establishment of a college prep high school. Beginning with eleven students, Mrs. Malone laid the foundation for a program that has seen marvelous results including recognition by the **Cardinal Newman Society** as one of the best authentically Catholic high schools in the United States. She remained as the first high school principal through the 2010-2011 school year.

Blessed Sacrament

Also in 1995 a long awaited dream for Sister Elise and other members of the Academy was fulfilled. Archbishop Thomas C. Kelly, O.P. granted permission for the Blessed Sacrament to be reserved at Holy Angels. Thus came the greatest gift bestowed on the Academy. Many graces would flow from Our Lord's presence in the school.

Chaplaincy

Blessed by Providence, another dream came true for Holy Angels in 2004 when the **Fathers of Mercy** agreed to



provide a full-time chaplain. Daily Mass and the opportunity for frequent reception of the sacraments has been a grace of inestimable value. In 2023 Holy Angels Academy partnered with the Order of Preachers to bring another chaplain to our school. Our community is blessed by the daily presence of two faithful priests in our school.

Locations

Holy Angels has served the community of Louisville, Kentucky from several locations over the years. First, it was the vacated school building of **St. Philip Neri Parish** in Old Louisville. Before relocating in the mid-seventies, the school began its longstanding devotion to the **Infant of Prague** for the financial needs of the Academy. From here the school occupied the school building at the **Dominican Parish of St. Louis Bertrand**. In the late seventies, **Franciscans of Saint Boniface Parish** provided a home in the old parish school building. It was in 1984 that Holy Angels was able to purchase an abandoned telephone building in Old Louisville only a few blocks from its original location. Some renovations provided an adequate learning environment, but any expansion would be prohibited on this small one acre lot.

After a lengthy search for a future location, in 1989 during a novena to the **Infant of Prague**, an available ten acre parcel of land was discovered in Middletown, Kentucky. After overcoming a number of obstacles that arose over several months, the land was eventually purchased and the deed recorded on **All Saints Day**. Following were a number of years of prayer, fundraising and addressing many more obstacles. Still well short of the funds to build, shortly after a novena to **Saint Joseph** by the students, faculty and parents, a generous benefactor responded to a request for several hundred thousand dollars. In his letter granting the request, he stated, **"God will build your school. Your school is deserving of the help it needs...but we want you to know we are merely the instrument through which your prayers are answered."** A new school building was erected in 2005. The dedication Mass was celebrated by Archbishop Thomas C. Kelly with auxiliary Bishop Charles Maloney attending. This campus now serves as a permanent home for Holy Angels Academy.

Philosophy

Holy Angels Academy is dedicated to the philosophy of educating the whole person. This involves the harmonious development of the mental, moral, and volitional powers, and the physical, emotional, and social capabilities of the students to prepare them to lead honorable and useful lives in order to attain the end for which they were created, that is, eternal happiness with God. To this end, a Catholic education in the classical tradition serves to form the mind in the pursuit of truth.

Objectives

- 1. To teach God's Commandments and instill in the students a strong devotion to Christ, His Blessed Mother and the Catholic Faith
- 2. To recognize the dignity and worth of each child and to provide for individual differences
- 3. To unite the Academy with the home in the formation of the child's character



- 4. To develop creative minds and help each child learn to think and work alone and with others
- 5. To help each child develop a sense of accomplishment
- 6. To instill in each child the appreciation of a good Catholic education
- 7. To orient each child with a sense of responsibility and respect for others

Structure & Governance

Holy Angels Academy is a private, independent Catholic co-educational school serving students from Preschool through Grade Twelve. It is organized as a non-profit 501(c)(3) corporation with oversight by a Board of Trustees. Entrusted to board members is the preservation and advancement of the mission and philosophy of the Academy as well as the obligation to safeguard its existence.

The Trustees employ the services of an administrator to implement the philosophy and policies as well as oversee the hiring of faculty and staff necessary for the day to day operations of the Academy.

Holy Angels enjoys recognition as a Catholic school by the **Archdiocese of Louisville** and recognizes and respects the proper jurisdiction of the local Bishop in matters relevant to instruction in the doctrines and beliefs of the Catholic Faith. As a private entity, the Academy operates independently of the Archdiocesan school system and the state system of schooling. It is not affiliated with any parish and receives no government funding.

As an affirmation of its Catholic identity and academic excellence, Holy Angels enjoys full accreditation with **NAPCIS** (*The National Association of Private, Catholic and Independent Schools*), is a member school of **ICLE** (Institute for Catholic Liberal Education), and is a Newman Guide recommended school of the **Cardinal Newman Society.**

Religion Curriculum

"God made us to know Him, love Him and serve Him in this world and to be happy with Him in the next." These simple but profound words from our catechism are the basis for religious instruction in the Catholic Faith. We cannot love what we do not know and we will not serve One whom we do not love. The chief truths taught by Jesus Christ through the Catholic Church are found in the Apostle's Creed and it is through Christ and His Church that our students learn to know, love, and serve God.

Catechetical instruction at all grade levels is in harmony with the **Catechism of the Catholic Church** with all instructors professing a loyalty to the Magisterial teachings of the Church. Each instructor annually makes a **Profession of Faith** and takes an **Oath of Fidelity** in the presence of the entire student body.

Catholic doctrine, scripture and the lives of the saints serve to lay a foundation at the elementary level. Memorization of the Commandments, Sacraments, Beatitudes and the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy give children a knowledge of their Catholic faith on which to build and guidelines for living a life befitting a Christian.

At the high school level students are exposed to a deeper understanding of their faith which leads to a deeper love and stronger willingness to serve God. Apologetics prepares students to explain and defend Church teachings. A Sacred Scripture course gives students the opportunity to learn from the words of Christ the Teacher. Church History provides an in-depth study of salvation history. Christian morality addresses the social issues of the day providing clarity about what is right and what is wrong, and young men and women are given the ethical guidelines to live their vocation in accordance with the will of God. Papal Encyclicals and other Church documents compliment instruction.

Spiritual Life

Sacraments, Devotions, Sacramentals

At the center of spiritual life is the Eucharist. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is offered daily by the Academy's Chaplain. Every First Friday Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament affords every class the opportunity to adore Our Lord exposed on the altar. Frequent visits to our Blessed Sacrament Chapel are encouraged. The sacrament of Penance is available for students on a frequent basis.

In addition to the sacramental life, traditional devotions to the Sacred Heart, the Blessed Mother, the angels and saints,



all contribute to a rich spiritual life at the Academy. Crucifixes, holy water fonts and religious images add to the Catholic environment.

The **Rosary**, or a portion, is prayed daily. Each child who has made his First Communion is enrolled in the **Brown Scapular**.

Academic Curriculum

The Academy provides a challenging curriculum that is rooted in the classical approach. An appreciation for what is true, good, beautiful and noble permeates studies at all grade levels.

The basics of reading, writing and arithmetic are at the core of the elementary program. Phonics is a vital component in the development of reading skills. Latin is introduced in the second grade. An emphasis on correct English grammar is essential in the development of strong writing and speaking skills. Diagramming of sentences aids this development. Memorization of math facts gives the student the necessary foundation upon which to build.

The high school grades provide a strong liberal arts education in preparation for college. The grammar foundation and the logic for sound reasoning are built upon with rhetorical skills necessary to articulate one's thoughts. Latin, the root of the romance languages, is normally a requirement. An in-depth study of the contributions of Western Civilization and of our beloved country is at the core of history lessons. The sciences are presented with the premise that God has created an orderly world and that man's obligation with experimentation and discovery is to always respect the plan of the Creator.

Textbook selection at all grade levels is governed by a test of compatibility with the mission and philosophy of Holy Angels. Scrutiny is exercised to ensure that material is presented in an objective manner and to avoid the adoption of texts which promote a particular political agenda or are deficient in providing content significant for the subject at hand. Where advantageous older texts which are out of print but are the best choice for compatibility are retained and respected as an important contribution.

In summation, the academic methodology and content are grounded in a classical approach which forms the mind to think in the pursuit of truth. The latest in educational thought which is in harmony with the Academy's educational philosophy is given serious consideration. It has been said that at Holy Angels "the best of the old meets the best of the new."

Character Formation

In the development of the human person sound character is formed in young people when they are expected to behave according to standards established for their own good. Faithful adherence to a set of standards fosters the virtues of obedience and humility. Further, the exercise of discipline in one's youth leads in no small way to self-discipline in adulthood.

At Holy Angels Academy we believe that a prerequisite to a good education is an ordered learning environment. The best discipline has its basis in the love of God, observance of the Ten Commandments, and high moral standards. **Time honored Christian values, not contemporary permissiveness, are the basis of the rules of conduct.** In their speech and in their actions students are to respect their elders and all those who have been placed by God in authority over them.

It is our wish at Holy Angels that girls and boys behave in a manner that is becoming of ladies and gentlemen and pleasing to God. Regulations which are established to govern the behavior of students should not be viewed as burdens but as a way to free one to act as one ought. Further, when expectations are fostered in a joyful environment, virtue becomes much more attainable for our youth.

Administration

Mr. Michael P. Swearingen, M.A.T., is the Headmaster of the Academy. Following experience teaching in the public school system, Mr. Swearingen taught Theology for seven years at DeSales High School in Louisville. He received his Bachelor of Arts Degree in History from the University of Louisville and his Master of Arts in Teaching, and certification from the U of L as well.



Mr. Erik R. Huff, B.A., serves as the Assistant Headmaster, Dean of Students, and Latin instructor for the Academy. Mr. Huff worked in parish ministry in the archdiocese prior to joining the staff at Holy Angels Academy. He received his Associate Degree in Business Management Technology in 2015 from the University of Cincinnati and his Bachelor of Arts degree from Catholic Distance University in Theology in 2021. Mr. Huff is currently pursuing a Master of Arts Degree from the Athenaeum of Ohio.



Miss Terri Glotzach, **M.S.**, serves as an assistant principal for the lower school. She has over forty years of experience in Catholic education, including thirty-three years at Holy Angels. She received her Bachelor of Science Degree and teaching certification from Indiana University Southwest and her Master of Science in Elementary Education from IUS as well.



Faculty

It should be noted that teachers and staff, religious or lay, willingly receive lower salaries or stipends than the norm for their experience and credentials. This sacrificial dedication is a sign of their apostolic zeal for what they see as a vocation. Such sacrifice contributes substantially to the financial stability of the Academy.

Teachers are chosen who are practicing Catholics professing an unswerving loyalty to all the teachings of the Church. On an annual basis, regardless of courses taught, each publicly makes a **Profession of Faith** and takes an **Oath of Fidelity** in the presence of the entire student body. Teachers must meet established criteria to clearly indicate one's harmony with the academic philosophy as well as the Academy's philosophy regarding the formation of children.

Although it is the norm of the Academy to seek those who are certified, much more important is one's educational background and ability to teach. The preparation for this noble undertaking differs in colleges of education and some practices may not be compatible with the educational philosophy

embraced at Holy Angels Academy. Normally, a minimum of an undergraduate degree is required and the candidate for a teaching position is expected to be well-suited to teach the academic content for the particular courses.

Historically, Holy Angels Academy has been blessed with many teachers with advanced degrees and a wealth of experience. More importantly these instructors, to whom our children are entrusted, must possess an apostolic zeal for the Church, a love of children, and a love of teaching with a joyful spirit.

Admission Policies



Admission Policies

Holy Angels Academy is a non-profit, independent, private Catholic school incorporated under the laws of Kentucky and recognized by the Archdiocese of Louisville. While maintaining independence as a private entity, Holy Angels Academy recognizes and respects the proper jurisdiction of the local bishop of the Archdiocese of Louisville in matters relevant to instruction in doctrines and beliefs of the Catholic Church. The Academy enjoys full accreditation by NAPCIS (National Association of Private Catholic and Independent Schools).

Admission Policies

Non-Discrimination Statement

Holy Angels Academy admits students of any race, color, nationality, or ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national and ethnic origin in the administration of its educational policies and athletic and other school-administered programs.

Holy Angels, however, does not have the personnel nor the facilities to effectively address the needs of children who have emotional or behavioral problems or learning disabilities that require special programs.

Catholic Families

Holy Angels Academy, as a Roman Catholic school, professes to support all the teachings of the Catholic Church as pronounced by the Magisterium. It is assumed that Catholic families seeking admission support the Academy in this profession and would only contribute to the harmonious spirit needed for their children to benefit from the education offered at Holy Angels fully.

Families of Other Faith Backgrounds

Families of other Faiths are more than welcome to inquire, but preference is given to Catholic families when considering space availability. When families of other Faiths are accepted, it is understood that they support the policies contained herein, including the policy that their children will be receiving religious instruction in the Catholic Faith and that they will be expected to attend Holy Mass and take part in any religious devotions or activities of the Academy. Parents of children of other Faiths, as do Catholic parents, further agree that their children are not permitted to debate the validity of Catholic teachings. However, this does not prohibit honest inquiry.

Any participation in secular activities expected of Catholic students is also expected of students of other Faiths. These may include civic activities that support a moral position compatible with the beliefs professed by the Catholic Church. One such example would be pro-life rallies opposing abortion held on school premises or elsewhere.

Readmission

If a family withdraws some or all of their students from Holy Angels and then expresses a desire to re-enroll, the Academy may refuse enrollment or require the family to complete the interview and registration process once again. This applies to all grade levels. Reasons to refuse readmission could be anything deemed by the administration to be detrimental to the harmony at Holy Angels Academy. Reasons may include but are not limited to the following:

- 1. Previous lack of support for the philosophy or policies of the school by parents or students.
- 2. Previous lack of cordial cooperation with, and support for, the teachers and administration.
- 3. Previous withdrawal that reflected negatively on the reputation of the Academy or its teachers.
- 4. A determination by the administration that a student acclimated to another program will have difficulty readjusting at Holy Angels.
- 5. A determination by the administration that a student's learning or behavioral needs will be better served elsewhere.

High School Transfers and Readmission Requests

1. Transfer Requests

It should be noted that students who request a transfer to Holy Angels Academy from another high school program, including any type of schooling program, may be denied admission due to certain considerations. Admission is on a case-by-case basis. Although not meant to be all-inclusive, practical reasons that follow may determine that Holy Angels is not suited to accommodate some students:

- availability of course offerings
- courses/credits required
- acclimation to the cultural environment and/ or the academic rigor at HAA
- fairness to currently enrolled students regarding grade point average, policy disparities

2. Readmission Requests

The norm is to deny readmission requests at the high school level. Practical reasons include but are not limited to, those on the list for transfer students (noted in No. 1 above). Only unusual circumstances would allow consideration to readmit students who have already attended, withdrawn, and then wish to re-enroll. Instances for readmission include past withdrawal due to a yearlong chronic illness or a return after an out-of-town relocation. Readmission is usually denied after withdrawing to pursue an alternative curriculum, extra-curricular or sports activities, or alternative instructors. Readmission is left to the administration's discretion, and reasons to deny such are not limited to those stated herein.



Required Fundraising (K - 12)

- For the above tuition rates to be possible, assistance with school fundraising is necessary.
- Families with students in grades K-12 are required annually through raffle sales, a personal tax-deductible donation, or a combination thereof to fundraise \$750 per family.

Payment Plan (Preschool - 12)

- Monthly payment plan: August 1st May 1st (Preschool 12); payment due by 1st of the month
- Payment in full before the first day of school or Alumni Parent 2% discount (K-12)
- Family tuition cap: \$20,500, not including preschool/prekindergarten (no additional discounts)

Explanation of Discounts (K - 12)

- Payment in full discount and alumni discount cannot be combined.
- Families receiving financial assistance through the CEF and Holy Angels Academy are not eligible for pre-payment or alumni discounts.
- Families at the family tuition cap of 20,500 are not eligible for pre-payment or alumni discounts.

Payment Policies

- 1. A **\$20.00 late fee** may be charged for payments ten or more days delinquent.
- 2. **Method of Payment**: Payment by check is the norm, but there is a **\$30.00 charge for returned checks**. After one returned check, the Academy may require payment in cash, cashier's check, or money order. Payment may be made electronically through the Academy's online payment system, but the payor must pay the transaction fee the processor charges.
- 3. Timely payments are <u>extremely</u> important for operating needs. Thus, the Academy reserves the right to refuse continued enrollment to any family that falls one or more months behind in tuition payments. Should a family need a special arrangement, the Academy must be contacted to request such.
- 4. **Delinquent Tuition**: Report cards, as well as permanent records, including health records, will be withheld at the end of the school year if required payments are not made in full unless arrangements have been made otherwise. **In addition, quarterly report cards may be withheld for delinquency with payments. If collection efforts are undertaken, the delinquent party will be responsible for reasonable attorney fees and collection costs.**

Financial Assistance

Financial assistance from the Academy is provided for those in true need who fully support the Academy. Families must first seek financial assistance by applying through the Catholic Education Foundation. Applications for such must be submitted each year that assistance is requested. Though there are priority deadlines for the initial rounds of assistance from the CEF, it is never too late to apply. After utilizing this resource and other possible options such as parish support, extended family support, etc., if a family is still in need, a request may be submitted to Holy Angels Academy for review. The Board of Trustees determines approval for assistance. When the Academy provides assistance, a work-study program is made available. It is important for parents to know that Holy Angels Academy does not possess a special fund for tuition assistance. However, faith in God's providence always results in the ability to help those in true need.

Refund Policies

- Application and registration fees are non-refundable.
- Book fees are non-refundable as those fees have already been applied to book costs.
- Tuition paid in advance is nonrefundable if a student withdraws early, as that tuition has already been applied to operating costs and general and administrative expenses.

Tuition Philosophy

In harmony with traditional Catholic thinking, Holy Angels Academy endeavors to do its best to keep tuition levels affordable. Generous discounts are provided for families with more than one child attending.

Every family is expected to contribute to the education of its children to the best of its ability. Those who have been blessed with the monetary means to do so are encouraged to make contributions to the Academy above tuition payments which will also allow them to exercise their tax-deduction privilege for charitable giving. As noted in the Parental Agreement, all families are expected to participate in certain fundraisers and tasks to help address the shortfall not provided by tuition. Only with this help, the contributions from generous benefactors from the larger community and the sacrifices of teachers and staff, will Holy Angels Academy continue alive and well.

DO I APPLY EVERY YEAR? Yes, you must apply for tuition assistance each year.

WHEN WILL I KNOW IF I HAVE BEEN GRANTED TUITION ASSISTANCE? Tuition assistance award notifications will be issued to families no later than March 1, 2025.



Admission Procedures

Admission to the Academy is premised on the following:

1. Review of Information and Parental Agreement

A thorough review of the material contained in the information packet is the first step to help parents determine if they desire to enroll their children at Holy Angels. Special attention should be given to the *Statement of Parental Agreement*.

2. Tour of Campus

An important step in the admission process is scheduling a tour of our campus, ordinarily to take place prior to submitting an application. A tour must be scheduled with the school in advance. Please contact the Academy at least one week prior to the day you wish to visit. Tours are normally scheduled for 9:30 AM allowing interested families to first attend Mass with the community at 9:00 AM. Alternate arrangements can be made for tours later in the day if necessary.

3. Submit Application(s) and Fee(s)

An application is to be completed for each child applying.

Supporting documents to accompany application(s):

- Scores on previous report cards and standardized tests (grades 1-12)
- Evidence of satisfactory behavior (grades 1-12)
- Ordinarily, families of transfer students are required to administer the Terra Nova 2 / CAT 6 standardized test to prospective students (grades 1-12)
 - These tests may be purchased from Seton Testings Services online, administered at home, then returned to Seton for grading
 - Parents will then forward a copy of the score reports to Holy Angels Academy once they are received
- High school placement test scores for incoming freshmen
- Any test results related to learning or behavioral disabilities (for all grades)
- Copy of official birth certificate (for all grades)
- Copy of official baptismal certificate (for all grades if baptized)

NOTE:

<u>Home Schoolers:</u> Documentation must be provided. Standardized test scores are required for grade placement as well as a copy of the curricula used. Work samples may be required. <u>Pre-schoolers:</u> Documentation must be provided. Any academic readiness or behavioral reports are required.

<u>Please be advised that Holy Angels Academy reserves the right to contact any school a student has previously attended, or is currently attending, before or after the family meeting.</u> This may be done to inquire about the status of the student concerning academic performance and behavior,

and/or to inquire about parental cooperation with teachers and staff, as well as cooperation with prompt payment of tuition.

4. Family Meeting

Should the application and accompanying documents indicate that a student is eligible to pursue enrollment, then the family will be notified to arrange a time for the meeting. **The student or students must be present with at least one parent.** Attendance of both parents is highly encouraged. This session may last from one to two hours, depending on the number of students present and the number of questions asked. Therefore, prospective students for the lower grades should bring something with them to occupy their time, such as a book to read, coloring books, etc. These sessions are normally held in the morning and parents and their children may also attend morning Mass if desired. Since the undivided attention of the parents is needed, it is requested that only children whose enrollment is considered be in attendance. Infants, of course, are welcome.

Much of the meeting is directed toward the parents, but the prospective students are also spoken with. The meeting gives parents an opportunity to expound upon their reasons for desiring the enrollment of their children. Some of the items in the literature are addressed to ensure there is a correct understanding of the parental role, including commitments in the *Statement of Parental Agreement* and of the Academy's expectations of their children. Parents are encouraged to ask any questions in order to have clarity about our program. Evidence of a sincere desire to support the Academy must be observed.

Importantly, this session also provides an opportunity for the headmaster or his delegate to expound upon the history and philosophy of the Academy and its purpose in Catholic education. A more in depth presentation is given regarding the religious education, character formation and classical curriculum.

5. Statement of Parental Agreement

This is to be signed and submitted after the pre-enrollment meeting with the administration has taken place. Families are welcome to take the agreement with them to prayerfully consider. A signed parental agreement is an enrollment requirement.

6. Registration and Textbook/Materials Fees

All fees must be submitted by the designated deadline for enrollment to be in force. A separate handout regarding these fees and tuition is provided.


7. Records

All medical records (i.e., immunizations, etc.) and any other required documents must be submitted by deadlines established by the Academy for enrollment to be officially in force. Holy Angels Academy must abide by the State of Kentucky standards in certain regards. Should any parents file for medical exemptions, it is incumbent upon them to provide approved documentation to the Academy.



Sample Statement of Parental Agreement

- I. We hereby acknowledge having read the admission policies and agree to support them if the Academy accepts us.
- II. We have completed the family meeting session with the headmaster or designate and agree to support the mission and philosophy of the Academy regarding religious education, the academic program, and the expected behavior of our children.
- III. We acknowledge that we have read the policies and guidelines for parents and students in the Parent/Student Handbook and other supplements provided by the school and agree to support and abide by these policies and procedures.
- IV. We agree to invest authority in the Academy to exercise, as necessary, reasonable means of discipline as outlined in the Parent/Student Handbook and other means deemed appropriate by the administration.
- V. *Kindergarten through Grade Twelve Families Only* We agree to provide volunteer service to the Academy to help defray the operating cost not met by tuition. We understand that this may include specific fundraising activities or other tasks required of each family.
 - a. Each family with students in grades K-12 is expected to participate in our annual raffle by selling or purchasing one hundred tickets at \$ 5.00 each. An option to meet this expectation is allowed by making a tax-deductible donation of \$750.00 or the remaining amount due for unsold tickets. Failure to meet this requirement results in billing for the amount owed and is treated the same as penalties for delinquent tuition.
 - b. Preschool, Prekindergarten, or Catechesis of the Good Shepherd-only families are encouraged to help with annual fundraising but not required.
- VI. We agree to pay tuition according to the Academy's policy. If collection efforts are undertaken due to a delinquency in payment, we agree to be responsible for reasonable attorney fees and collection costs.
- VII. We attest that to the best of our knowledge, all information we have provided on the application(s) and contained in the documents submitted is true and correct.
